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IMPORTANT BOARD PRESENTATION ON APRIL 11TH REGARDING BUDGET CUTS

April 5, 2024

Dear South Brunswick School Community,

Over the past few weeks, we have held a series of open forums for the community and staff to learn more about the budget challenges facing our community. We have recently provided you with recordings of these forums (click here) where we shared that we have a **revenue shortage** of \$6,200,000 due to the State's continued assault on our budget over the last 6 years. We have shared these recordings with you to ensure transparency and invited you to these forums to provide participation.

The administration has been working tirelessly around the clock for the last few months attempting to limit the impact of this substantial deficit; however, cutting over \$6,000,000 out of a budget will not come easy and without significant loss to the district. Below we have outlined the current expected impact to our district. For a more comprehensive understanding of our financial situation, we urge you to review any of the recent forums where we have provided detailed explanations.

On April 11th, during the Board of Education meeting, we will be holding a special session dedicated to discussing these reductions and changes. There will be time set aside for public comment and a Q&A from the school community specifically on the budget topics listed below.

HERE IS A GENERAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT CHANGES AND LOSSES

REDUCTIONS & IMPACTS

- Approximately 65+ staff positions reduced (5% of our staff)
 - Teachers
 - Administrators
 - Supervisors
 - Custodians/Maintenance
 - Paraprofessionals
 - Secretaries
 - Coaches
 - Club advisors
 - Other district professionals
 - Increased Class Sizes K-12 regular and special education classes
- Reduction in student supports and opportunities

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- Removal of B teams from Middle School Athletics.
- High School limiting student class switches
- High School course cut-offs
- Reduced Security
- Overall reduced customer service
 - o Slower response time to queries due to reduced staff/higher class size.
 - HIB investigations taking longer.
 - o Grading taking longer due to more students in classes.

INCREASED FEES

- Pay to Play increasing
- High School Student Parking fees increasing
- Advanced Placement Testing fee increasing
- Lunch prices increasing
- Chromebook insurance fee increasing
- Facility Rental Fees Increasing
- Full cost payment for all field trips
- NEW Fee for Late Buses
- NEW Implementation of Subscription busing (+1-mile K-8, +1.25 miles 9-12)

While we acknowledge these fee increases are unwelcomed and undesired, they are necessary to sustain our programs and continue providing enriching experiences for all our students.

As you will see by watching the forums, we're actively advocating to the State to reconsider the funding cuts and to see the error of its ways and will be monitoring legislature activity. The district's final budget adoption is scheduled for May 7, 2024.

Before you come out to the meeting on April 11th, please make sure to watch the <u>forum</u> so you are fully informed as to why the district is facing this financial crisis. PLEASE BE AWARE THAT WE WILL NOT BE REPEATING THE INFORMATION FROM PRIOR MEETINGS. THE APRIL 11TH MEETING WILL BE SOLELY GEARED TOWARDS THE INFORMATION IN THIS LETTER.
